Our schools have resumed a normal rhythm, the children are almost all back, their health is good, their academic level better than we had feared.

Siem Reap, whose roads have been completely renovated, is seeing a massive return of tourists, which is excellent for the financial health of our families.

After the reopening of our schools, we are approaching the new year full of optimism and enthusiasm, with a renewed young and feminine leadership.

Indeed, we have the joy of welcoming Somary THUON, who, after her studies in France and a good start of her career in Cambodia, notably at Tuk SAT, has taken the direction of our NGO since October, still under the presidency of Phyrum Chhiv. His commitment to the long term and his good understanding of the local context will facilitate the work of all of us and allow us to be even more efficient in our actions. Our team on the spot (employees, volunteers) is working with enthusiasm and generosity.

This is an opportunity to thank them for their tremendous commitment.

A big thank you also to those who faithfully support us. It is a source of strength and obligation. The team of volunteers who make up the office in France is committed and generous and allows our project to overcome the difficulties and to realize the projects that you support.

At the time of printing this report, two shadows have appeared at the end of 2022:

The euro/dollar parity makes us lose 20% of our financing capacity and inflation makes the equation more complicated every day. We will have to redouble our efforts to find the necessary financing, your help will be beneficial.

It seems that a significant part of our families living near the temples have been relocated to 35km, decision of the government, following the remarks made by UNESCO concerning the protection of the archaeological sites of the temples.

At this time we are looking for the best solution to continue to run our elementary school and at the same time support the children of our relocated families.

I have no doubt that our teams will succeed in the impossible and overcome these obstacles, with the support of all, for the good development of the children.









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Our organization

The Bayon School is an association under the French law of 1901 registered in France as S.E.P. du Bayon and in Cambodia as an organization under Cambodian law, Bayon Education & Development. It has been active in Cambodia in the area of the Angkor temples for more than 25 years.

We currently fund and support the education and training of nearly **450 children**, young adults and families:

Approximately 250 children in kindergarten and primary school, in a school located near the Bayon temple in the archaeological area of Angkor.

About 150 young people in secondary school. We support them financially, socially and through tutoring so that they can continue their studies in the public high schools of Siem Reap.

14 young scholarship holders who have chosen to continue their studies at the university.



Our mission

To provide quality education to disadvantaged children and youth living in the Angkor temple area.

Approximately 20 young women from disadvantaged backgrounds who are undergoing a one-year training course in pastry-making and baking.

Eleven families who have created **vegetable gardens** to supply the school canteen.

Five families who have started a sewing activity to make school uniforms.

16 students from disadvantaged regions of Northern Cambodia who are following a complete training in agroecology, created in partnership with Pour Un Sourire d'Enfant.

Because health is an important factor in the success of schooling, the Bayon School takes care of the health needs of the students and provides them with a balanced and quality diet every day.


We also educate the children, their families and the staff on **hygiene and prevention** to avoid medical problems as much as possible.

Our ambition Moving forward



After 2 years of pandemic during which our schools were closed and our activities slowed down, Siem Reap and the whole of Cambodia have seen the restrictions gradually lifted as of December 2021.

Our schools have reopened and our students are back in school, allowing our teams to be back on the ground with them. If the beginnings were done in a trial and error manner due to the multiple health recommendations, our objective has been to relaunch our activities one after the other, accompanying those whose situation was particularly affected by the passage of Covid.

From our primary school students to their families, as well as from our farmers to our vocational students, we have focused our attention on providing quality and close support to give everyone the means to return to a normal rhythm as possible.

This year has shown that our efforts have not been in vain, and that the success of our students also depends on the support of our teams. The particular context of this new school year 6

has not prevented us from developing new projects while reinforcing the pedagogical framework already in place.

Today, one year later, we are happy to see that tourists are back at the Coffee Shop and that each day that passes is a step closer to a return to normal: a coffee shop in the heart of the city whose products are known for their quality, students invested in their training, smiling children in the schoolyard and farmers whose vegetable production continues to increase.

As the end of the year approaches, our thoughts now turn to the implementation of an effective and relevant strategy to take our activities further and consolidate the pedagogical structures patiently built for almost 30 years.

Support from the earliest age

CREATION OF A KINDERGARTEN

In order to offer our students the most complete entry into their school career possible, we decided to open a kindergarten from the age of 4 at the beginning of 2022. The main objective of this program is to develop early learning and to facilitate the entry into the second year of kindergarten and into Grade 1 the following year.

In total, 25 young children have begun their learning at the Ecole du Bayon, accompanied by our teachers and our pedagogical team: if the beginnings are shy, this small section allows each one to gain autonomy and personal confidence, reinforcing their capacity to learn and concentrate.

FROM PRIMARY SCHOOL TO OUR PROFESSIONAL TRAINING

To complement their openness to the world and the opportunities they will have throughout their educational journey, this year we have **set up meetings** with our vocational students. These exchange times, within the Bayon, contribute to the strengthening of the link between our programs and to the idea that, at the Bayon School, a child's education can take place from primary school to university if he or she so wishes.

The goal is also to strengthen the internal recruitment of our students for our agroecology and pastry courses. Grade 6 students were able to participate in a cooking workshop with our students and Grade 4 came to exchange with Sakoth and our students at the agroecology school for a workshop on seeds and compost.

PROJECT OPEN YOUR EYES

A new project dedicated to photography

Several workshops are held each week and are essential to the learning process of each student. With the idea of developing their curiosity and openness to the world, the «Open Your Eyes» project was born from this desire to offer them a new field of learning and artistic expression.

Having very little access to this medium in their daily lives, we wanted to give the **students of Grade 6** the opportunity to understand what it is, and to practice it.

The workshop took place in 2 stages:

A first day of presentation on what is photography and how it works. It was also an opportunity to introduce them to some names of Cambodian photographers known for their pictures throughout the country.

The second part of the workshop consisted of giving each student a disposable camera, along with some ideas for a theme that would allow them to express themselves freely on their vision of the world.





This approach aims to shed light on the context in which they live, by letting them express themselves about their daily life and how they perceive it themselves.

FROM HIGH SCHOOL TO UNIVERSITY

From the beginning, we have been committed to supporting our students in their academic journey from elementary school through high school and on to college.

Again this year, we are giving special attention to those who wish to continue their studies at the university level.

They are 14 students who benefit from a scholarship, allowing them to cover their tuition fees, the purchase of their equipment, their housing - for some - and their daily expenses to meet their needs.

Our social teams regularly check in with them, keeping a strong link with our alumni.

We hope that their success will give our youngest students the desire to study at university as well.

And after I graduate, I hope to have many opportunities.


Hygiene & Health An efficient follow-up

HEALTHY STUDENTS

While we might have thought that the pandemic would have had a negative impact on the health of our students, our doctors Jean-Pierre and Michèle were pleased to note that their growth went well during these two years of Covid.

This observation allows us to realize that our medical follow-up set up since their first year is bearing fruit and that our hygiene awareness sessions are listened to and heard.

No emergency intervention was reported and the ophthalmic and dental care also went well.

Rath Nga, who has been suffering from Hirschsprung's disease for a few years, has been wearing a colostomy bag for a long time in order to treat the intestinal obstruction he had suffered from.

Vigilance and monitoring by our teams, aware that his well-being and personal development depended on recovery from this disease.

After several surgeries in Phnom Penh and thanks to the mobilization of our donors, Rath Nga is now healed and has been able to return to a peaceful daily life.

We are very happy to know that it has a great future ahead of it!

Increasing our market access

DEVELOP THE SALE OF VEGETABLE BASKETS

One of our main lines of thought concerning our vegetable garden project is to find ways to **market our vegetables** in Siem Reap town.

In this sense, we launched in April the sale of vegetable baskets in our Coffee Shop, allowing our farmers to supplement their income through these sales.

These baskets are composed of vegetables from their gardens, respecting the principles of **sustainable agriculture**.

We now have the opportunity to introduce them to the regulars of the Coffee Shop!





CONTINUE FOOD DISTRIBUTIONS

In order to continue to alleviate the lack of income for our families, and because our vegetable production continues to grow, we have decided to **extend the food distribution** at the primary school **until December.**

This allows families affected by **the rainy season** to have something to eat while waiting for the return of the good weather.

Practice at the heart of learning

IMPROVE OUR TRAINING

After a first class whose year took place during the pandemic, our **second promotion** entered our agroecology school in January 2022: **16 students,** with equal parity between girls and boys.

This second year has been an opportunity to **improve our welcome**, both in the classroom and in the **structure of the school**. Our **experimental farm** has been fully set up, allowing our students to have multiple supports to put their **theoretical lessons into practice**.

The farm now comprises:

- a greenhouse
- a henhouse
- a vegetable garden
- a nursery
- a mushroom farm (myciculture)
- a fish farm (pisciculture)

MEET THE HAZARDS OF THE TERRAIN

Because it is important to confront the obstacles and challenges of the field, our students worked alongside our farmers for 5 months, in groups of 2, on their vegetable gardens. Thus, they were able to realize the hazards related to the environment, the weather and the insects present on the farms.

This mutual exchange between our students and our farmers allowed them to implement solutions together to optimize the production of vegetables as well as to learn to manage and pilot a project over several months.




Funding sources 2021-2022


Our expenses 2021-2022


